Our music festival is the UK's largest Mardi Gras celebration which showcases Hastings' thriving music scene – opening its doors to a wealth of musical talent and music fans alike.

Hailed as Hastings' answer to SXSW in Texas, or Brighton's Great Escape festival, Hastings Fat Tuesday takes place over five days, from March 1-5. It kicks off with a party on Friday. Saturday features 200 unplugged gigs played by 40 bands at 20 venues. There's Sonics, which is a two-day celebration of avant garde electronic music. Under The Radar showcases emerging artists from across the UK across four stages, curated by BBC Introducing, Joe Strummer Foundation, Off Axis, ACM, and Incubate. Preservation Sunday kicks off with the Umbrella Parade - an explosion of colour, music, food and fun for all the family. Monday sees the return of Un-Convention, a day-long music industry event with diverse panellists. That night, King Size Slim performs, plus music trivia fans will tear their hair out at David Quantick's notoriously tough quiz. It ends with the chaotic Fat Tuesday Tour, where 12 venues host sets by 24 bands and an after party which continues into the early hours.

Since starting in 2009, Hastings Fat Tuesday remains a communitydriven festival that is primarily free and does a lot for the local music community. It's great fun and we look forward to seeing you there.

Mardi Gras - that's French for Fat Tuesday. lingua-fans - wasn't always about good food, loud music, dancing and beads. The event's origins can be traced back thousands of years to the Roman festivals of Saturnalia (a predecessor to Christmas) and Lupercalia.

a yearly practice to helpfully

drive away evil spirits from the city of Rome, and restore health and fertility.

When Christianity came to the Italian capital, church leaders decided to absorb these popular, local traditions into the new faith, rather than simply prohibit them. A bit less hassle. all told. Mardi Gras then became a gluttonous blowout in the run-up to Lent, a 40-day period of fasting and abstinence before Easter Sunday.

Along with Christianity, Mardi Gras celebrations

spread from Rome to other European nations. including France, Germany, Spain and England.



Louisiana - and New Orleans in particular - is renowned for its outlandish Mardi Gras parties. The first American celebration took place on March 3, 1699, when French explorers Pierre Le Moyne d'Iberville and Sieur de Bienville arrived at present-day New Orleans.

> naming the area Point du Mardi Gras.

When the Spanish took control of New Orleans in 1763, however, the authorities banned these festivities until Louisiana became a U.S. state in 1812.

On Mardi Gras in 1827, a group of students wore colourful outfits and danced through New Orleans, replicating the celebrations they'd witnessed in Paris. A decade later, the first recorded New Orleans Mardi Gras parade took place, a tradition that continues to this day.

Louisiana is the only state which recognises Mardi Gras as a legal holiday, thanks to Governor Warmoth who signed the 'Mardi Gras Act' in 1875. And since the early 90s, dogs have got in on the act, thanks to the non-profit organisation, the Mystic Krewe of Barkus, who hold an annual pooch parade. No alcohol here. though.

This year, Mardi Gras takes place on March 5. Hangovers will, without a doubt, kick in the following day, all the way from Bourbon Street to our very own George Street.





Showcasing the best in new music both regionally and nationally, Hastings Fat Tuesday was established in 2009 by musician Bob Tipler and event organiser Adam Daly, inspired by New Orleans' raucous take on Mardi Gras. combining the enjoyment of good music, a flair for dressing-up and partying. The event, which celebrates its 10th anniversary this year, has grown into a key event in the Hastings cultural calendar, which attracted an audience of 14,000 over five days last year.

"Before 2009, I ran it as a Hastings Mardi Gras for a few years," explains Bob. "I lived locally and had a band called The Cajun Dawgs. I'd just put a gig on at the Brass Monkey and put us on as the support act for whoever was the biggest band in town. It ran its course as an event, but I thought it could have bigger potential because it was Shrove Tuesday night. I met Adam and he had the vision and experience to grow it into a bigger event."

The first Fat Tuesday event was "insane", remembers Adam. With members of the Bonfire Society building a portable proscenium,



it was moved from the Old Town's pubs The FILO, The Jenny Lind, and the Dragon Bar. A number of acts would perform a short set in front of the arch as it was moved from venue to venue before rounding off the evening at a "heaving" Pissaro's on South Terrace.

"The thing about Hastings is that it has this fantastic music scene anyway." says Adam. "We did about five years on a shoestring and on a wing and a prayer, before we got funding from the Arts Council"

HISTORY OF



The following years have included headline acts Dodgy, The Membranes, Skinny Lister and Skunk Anansie, while local acts and artistic collectives have had the fantastic opportunity to showcase their talents to a much wider audience. Last year, Hastings Fat Tuesday made the Telegraph's list of the world's top 13 places to party. Most recently, the team were presented with Event Of The Year accolade at The Celebration of Sussex Life Awards, fending off competition from Brighton Fringe and Chiddingly Festival.

"The idea was to promote this extraordinary side of Hastings that nobody knew about and just get it out there," says Bob. "It's grown organically every year and it just gives people the chance to experience creative, interesting, music in our town."



Hastings claims to be the most famous town in the world, but it's not just because of 'that' battle that people come here now.

With a fantastic medieval Old Town crammed full of boutique shops and fantastic eating (and drinking!) places, and 1000 years of maritime history, to the unique splendour of St Leonards with its Georgian architecture and newly-discovered urban chic, it is rightfully gaining a reputation as the up and coming place to visit.

Hastings does quirky and Bohemian so well, and also loves to dress up and party, so do check out our events programme. After Hastings Fat Tuesday we've got Jack in the Green over the May Day bank holiday, Midsummer Fish Fest in June, Pirate Day in July, Old Town Carnival Week in August, our huge Seafood and Wine Festival in September, and Hastings Week (including our amazing torchlight procession and fireworks) in October. And between our bigger events we've got an incredible year round live music scene in our pubs and other venues.

To relax, enjoy a stroll the length of our threemile long seafront, explore the award winning Alexandra Park, or our wild Country Park. Then there's adventure golf, two funicular railways, some fantastic museums, and even a light show every night in Bottle Alley! Enjoy!

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Radiophonic Workshop





Electronic pioneers Radiophonic Workshop will head to Hastings on March 3 to premiere a specially-created work as part of Fat Tuesday.

The sonic innovators - who've worked on a number of classic TV shows - will be performing live as part of Sonics, using found sounds inspired by life in Hastings to create a unique piece of audio art. Composer Paddy Kingsland tells us what we can expect on the night...

THE RADIOPHONIC WORKSHOP HAVE WORKED ON DOCTOR WHO AND THE HITCHHIKER'S GUIDE AND THEY'VE **REMAINED MUCH LOVED PROGRAMMES** DECADES LATER.

The lovely thing about those programmes was that they were the sort of thing that lent themselves to what we could do with electronic sounds, music and effects. If you worked on TV, you thought, 'Well, we'll put it all together and it goes out next Friday and that's the end of it', but some of those shows have lived on and it's very gratifying to hear the stuff again."

WHAT SORT OF SOUNDS DO YOU SUGGEST PEOPLE SUBMIT FOR YOUR UPCOMING SONICS PERFORMANCE?

Impact sounds, like banging something with a hammer or hitting a saucepan. Creaking doors or squeaks and scrapes are quite useful because you can put them together in a series

of notes. It could be an organ note in a church or playing an out of tune chord on a guitar, any number of things. Basically keep it clean, keep it short and do a few alternatives.

HOW WILL YOU USE THESE FOUND SOUNDS?

We did this fair and we had a room set up where we recorded sounds from people who just wandered by. Then we'd put it together to make a piece. I think this idea is similar, except with the added dimension that we'll add those sounds in on the night! I love doing the gigs and this is a slightly new aspect that I haven't done before.

SO WHAT'S NEXT FOR THE RADIOPHONIC WORKSHOP?

Roger Limb, Tom Middleton and I have recorded a whole load of stuff and we're hoping that's going to be released as an album fairly soon. Peter Howell has been working on things with a view to releasing an album as well. Dick Mills has been working with Kieron Pepper, too. There's quite a lot of stuff going on.

Glen Matlock

Glen first played Hastings in 1976 as bassist with the Sex Pistols, who supported Welsh rockers Budgie on the pier. We caught up with him to find out about his recent album Good To Go and what we can expect during his band's Fat Tuesday Tour shows...

WHAT ARE YOUR MEMORIES OF THAT **HASTINGS GIG?**

Not a lot really, it was so long ago. I do remember asking Budgie's singer [Burke Shelley], who had a high voice, why they called their band that and he said. 'It's because I sound like a budgie'. His bass stack was about eight Vox AC30s on top of each other, which was a bit weird. I remember Malcolm McLaren [Sex Pistols' manager] and Jamie Reid [who did the Never Mind The Bollocks, Here's The Sex Pistols artwork] were around. I'd been to Hastings as a kid, actually. My grandparents had retired and moved to Hartley, which is near Cranbrook. I'd get a bottle of Coke and crisps and watch my granddad have a few pints and a plate of whelks.

WHO'LL BE IN YOUR BAND AT FAT TUESDAY?

Chris Musto on drums, Jim Lowe on bass, I'm playing rhythm guitar and singing, and Neal X, who was guitarist in Sigue Sigue Sputnik.

WILL IT BE MIXING UP THE SETS FOR THE FANS WHO'LL FOLLOW YOU AROUND TOWN?

I suppose so. I do what I do these days and I'll throw in a couple of old ones to keep people

happy. It's not all 1976. There'll be some songs from my new album Good To Go, but I'll just see what the crowd's like and play it by ear.

THE NEW ALBUM IS SOMETHING OF A DEPARTURE FOR YOU, WHAT INSPIRED THE CHANGE IN DIRECTION?

I've been playing acoustic shows over the last 20 years and every song I've ever written was on an acoustic guitar. On the album, most of the songs were recorded with Slim Jim Phantom, who's a renowned rockabilly type.

YOU JUST RELEASED KEEP ON PUSHING AS A SINGLE. COULD YOU TELL US WHAT THIS PARTICULAR SONG IS ABOUT?

I've found that musicians and artistic types are always full of ideas and there's always people around who'll say, 'No, you can't do that'. Why not? Just do it and keep on trying and you might just get somewhere. You know, it's quite a good vardstick for many avenues of life.

WHAT DOES THE REST OF THE YEAR HOLD FOR YOU?

I'm doing a charity thing with Slim Jim at the end of March. I've got a little tour of Sweden coming up in April, a tour in May and we've just been offered to play the Fuji festival in Japan at the end of July. We're talking about going to the States, too. We're looking forward to playing Hastings. Can anyone recommend a decent chippy?



Music is the lifeblood of Hastings, and never is this more in evidence than when the bars and restaurants of the Old Town host a packed afternoon of acoustic music sessions. Over 40 emerging and established artists and bands across myriad genres play 15-minute sets at venues all over town. A couple of notches below the all-out pace of the Fat Tuesday Tour, this FREE event still packs a punch in terms of musical diversity, with everything from acoustic rock to Irish folk, a-capella, blues, brass, shanties and world music. Take a chance on something new, follow your favourite act from venue to venue or hole up with food and drink and wait for them to come to you; it's best to book at participating restaurants if you plan to eat – and eating is highly recommended.

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Sonics is curated by James Weaver, a founder member of Warrior Squares, a Hastings-based collective who make music in free improvisation form. It was devised in 2015 by artist and musician Danny Pockets, who sadly lost his long battle with cancer in 2018. The aim was to bring the rich, underground seam of experimental music and art within Hastings and St. Leonards-on-Sea out into the open. In subsequent years the event has consistently delivered diverse, vibrant and fun days of visual and sonic adventure.

WHEN DID THE IDEA FOR SONICS FIRST COME ABOUT?

Thee Sunday Sonics was initially put together in 2015 as a free entry event within the Fat Tuesday weekend by artist and musician Danny Pockets, working in collaboration with a range of artists, musicians and filmmakers. Danny's creativé drive, charm, restless imagination and determination succeeded in bringing the rich, underground seam of experimental music and art within the town out into the open for all to experience.

WHAT IS THE AIM OF THIS EVENT?

The aim of Sonics 19 is to showcase a range of cutting edge, underground electronic, experimental music and art. Expanded over two days for the first time, the event will transform the venue space with a strong visual element, sound art, installations, DJs, workshops, talks and records stalls. We're trying to provide a welcoming, relaxed space for people to discover, experience and potentially interact with something that is a bit different and, most importantly, fun!

WHICH ACTS ARE YOU LOOKING FORWARD TO SEEING PERFORM AT THIS YEAR'S SONICS EVENT?


I'm looking forward to seeing all of them perform! They have all been chosen as they

take an uncompromising and unique approach to exploring sound, performance and music, be they local or from further afield. The bill includes a number of influential figures in the world of underground and electronic music. The Saturday includes performances by sevenpiece noise/feedback choir The Larsens, the lo-fi motorik synths and dub crackle of Xylitol and Leyden Jars, Simon Crab's cinematic sound design and Radioactive Man closing the event by bringing world renowned electro and bass weight to Hastings for the first time. Local electro duo, Vile Electrodes are the perfect opening act for the legendary Radiophonics Workshop on the Sunday evening.

DANNY POCKETS SADLY LOST HIS BATTLE WITH CANCER LAST YEAR. HOW WILL HE BE REMEMBERED AT THE SONICS TWO-DAY EVENT?

Selections of Danny Pocket's film work and other pieces of his art will feature and form part of the fabric of the event. Thee Sunday Sonics was an event that was really important to Danny, one that he wanted to ensure continued and developed into the future. Danny's no-compromise, no bullshit approach to music and art alongside his positivity and generosity of spirit set the tone of previous Sunday Sonics events and remains a massive influence on how this event has taken shape.

SONICS WILL HOST THE PREMIERE OF RADIOPHONIC WORKSHOP'S NEW WORK WHICH UTILISES FOUND SOUNDS CONTRIBUTED BY HASTINGS RESIDENTS. TELL US ABOUT HOW THEY GOT INVOLVED AND THEIR FAR-REACHING INFLUENCE. Radiophonics Workshop got involved due to their current drummer having a previous link to Fat Tuesday from earlier years. Their influence on music, be it electronic music, rock or film soundtracks is immeasurable.

THE JOE STRUMMER FOUNDATION'S Jamie Webb





The Joe Strummer Foundation are just one of the organisations who are curating a stage at Fat Tuesday's Under The Radar. We caught up with charity coordinator Jamie Webb to find out more...

FOR THE UNINITIATED, COULD YOU TELL US A LITTLE ABOUT THE JOE STRUMMER FOUNDATION?

It's a charity that was set up in 2014 which provides opportunities to musicians and support to projects globally that create empowerment through music.

WHAT PROJECTS HAVE YOU BEEN WORKING ON IN THE LAST FEW MONTHS?

We ended 2018 with a series of fundraisers and showcases between Hastings, Hull and London and focusing on the year ahead. Last week, we were in Freetown, Sierra Leone with a small team which included Frank Turner. We went to visit WAYout Arts – Worldwide Arts for Youth – a charity that supports disadvantaged and street youth through the arts. The Joe Strummer Foundation, formerly Strummerville, has been supporting their work since 2012 when we shipped and set up a music studio in their Freetown hub.

HOW ELSE HAVE THE FOUNDATION HELPED FREETOWN?

We worked on a fundraising campaign towards the end of 2018 so that WAYout could purchase a 4 x 4 vehicle and mobile recording equipment so that they can reach more young people in the suburbs of Freetown and the provinces. One of the values of us being there is to inspire the young people. Many of the people have nothing and the fact that they are engaging and learning through the work of WAYout helps them become accepted in their communities.

CAN YOU TELL US ABOUT THE ARTISTS YOU ARE BRINGING TO FAT TUESDAY THIS YEAR?

We're bringing down the fantastic Two from London; the amazing Gemma Rogers who is a fantastic singer/songwriter, playwright and actress. She has been supporting the JSF for years and is a bit of a legend, actually. She plays with Alfie Jackson, another talented musician and writer who has been playing in bands and solo for as long as I can remember. There's the uber-talented J. Nicholas and Rob Marenghi, too. I'm looking forward to these unplugged sets as I've not 'done' the Saturday before. Snak Dracula are a group made up of seasoned pros from bands who the JSF have always championed. They've only played a handful of shows, one of which was in Hastings last month and they popped. Certainly worth catching. Young local heroes Mystic Shed also played on that bill and blew me away so I'm thrilled they've agreed to come and represent on the Sunday. On the Tuesday tour itself, we have ex-pro skateboarder turned country musician CJ McRaven, and TPM from County Louth. A friend of the JSF found them playing in the depths of the infamous Piano Bar at Glastonbury one Monday morning. Not to be missed!

RADIOPHONIC WORKSHOP

These audio alchemists are responsible for the Doctor Who theme, The Hitchhiker's Guide To The Galaxy, Quatermass, Living Planet and many other classic BBC TV and radio music.

Founded in 1958 by Desmond Briscoe and Daphne Oram, the BBC Radiophonic Workshop was home to a maverick group of experimental composers, sound engineers and musical innovators, who set about exploring new ways of using technology to create sounds.

They created the soundtracks to some of BBC television and radio's most iconic programmes and their influence on popular music has been profound, from The Beatles, The Rolling Stones, Prince and Pink Floyd through to contemporary electronic artists and DJs such as Aphex Twin, Four Tet and The Orb. Almost two decades after the Workshop was decommissioned by John Birt, original members Peter Howell, Roger Limb, Dr Dick Mills, Paddy Kingsland and longtime associate Mark Ayres are working together once more.



THE BRASS FUNKEYS

Here's an eight-piece brass band who hail from London via their spiritual home of New Orleans. Forming in 2011, their self-described blend of "spirited second line revelry, soulful jazz funeral marches, galloping gypsy czárdás and pumping brassdriven funk" has captivated crowds at Glastonbury, Wilderness festival in Oxfordshire and the legendary Ronnie Scott's jazz club in Soho. Whether it's on stage or as a marching band, miss infectious octet at your peril. Their latest album, Rabble Rouser, is out now.




DANNY RAMPLING

Award-winning DJ and producer Danny Rampling is pioneer of the dance scene. Through his legendary Acid House club Shoom in the 1980s and his radio shows with BBC Radio 1 and Kiss FM. Danny shaped the UK dance scene as we know it today. The author of a bestselling book, Everything You Need To Know About DJing & Success, Rampling has sold over a million compilation albums and was named No 1 DJ in the World in DJ Mag's first-ever Top 100 Poll. He continues to be at the forefront of the global scene.



London-based producer Keith Tenniswood is renowned for his bass-warped take on electro. Credited with coproducing the award-winning Lets Get Killed with David Holmes, he also engineered the live sound for Sabres of Paradise on the Primal Scream UK tour in 1996, and was among the first to contribute to fabric's mooted DJ mix series. A collaboration between Simon Lynch (London Modular Alliance), Monoak (Freerotation) and Badioactive Man - will release their Rambler EP on February 15 through Asking For Trouble.



WILL VARLEY

This UK singer-songwriter cut his teeth touring the country's open-mic nights. often using fake ID to gain entry for many years. He's opened for the likes of Frank Turner, Billy Bragg, Valerie June. Beans on Toast and The Proclaimers. And like the Scottish duo. Will has even walked 500 miles whilst playing a show each night from Lands End to his hometown of Deal. in Kent. His latest album, Spirit Of Minnie – his fifth studio release - is out now through Xtra Mile Recordings.



BEANS ON TOAST

National treasure and Essexborn "drunk folk singer" Jay McAllister first came to the wider world's attention after performing at Glastonbury in 2005. Four years later, he released his debut album, Standing On A Chair. The 50-track double album was produced by Ben Lovett of Mumford & Sons and featured guest spots from Emmy The Great and Frank Turner. Since then, he's released an album every year on December 1 - his birthday - and his tenth studio effort. A Bird In The Hand, was released in 2018.



40 SHILLINGS ON THE DRUM

Hailing from Brighton, these folk punks are armed to the teeth with songs about life, love, friendship, and getting smashed out of your brain.

ALIBI

Indie rock four-piece from Hastings whose single Space, Man earned them numerous plays on BBC Introducing and a spot at Reading and Leeds festivals.

ANIMAL NOISE

Dealing in swathes of experimental indie rock, this Colchester trio have earned airplay on Radio 1 BBC Radio 6music, BBC Introducing and Radio X.

ARXX

Hannah and Clara are a Brighton-based garage rock duo who've released their debut EP, Daughters of Daughters in 2018. Two songs from the release – Intervention and Stuck On You – were featured on BBC Introducing.

BEV LEE HARLING

Hastings resident Bev Lee Harling and her band – featuring her partner and their young son, Charlie – mix up elements of folk, jazz and soul.

BRUCH

This Hampshire solo artist blends curious, electronic sounds, multi-layered vocals and ethereal melodies, bringing her classical cello training into the mix for a truly eclectic experience.

BUDDHA TRIANGLE

Hastings collective who incorporate soul, funk, reggae and hip hop to create a unique sound based around freestyle jams.

CHANTELLE DUNCAN'S FUNK REPUBLIC

CJ MCRAVEN

This "rebel on the run breaking down barriers one by one," is a country artist from the New Forest.

SIMON CRAB

Simon Crab is probably most well known as the founder of Bourbonese Qualk, as well as Sunseaster, an experimental-improvisedelectro-acoustic noise project.

CRUMBS ON THE BLOODY CARPET

This Hastings duo offer tales told straight from the heart, with 90s Britpop inspired riffs and haunting lines on cello.

CURRLS

A Brighton-based three-piece who infuse glam rock, post punk and new wave influences into songs which pack a punch.

DR SAVAGE AND THE SECOND LINE BAND

The irrepressible, megaphone-wielding band leader and his ensemble bring their distinct Mardi Gras revelry to Hastings Fat Tuesday.

ELEPHANT RADIO

Dreamy pop rock from along the A259 in Eastbourne, who've recently signed to American-based label House Cat Records.

FAT FINGERS OF FUNK

Born from a mutual love of Jazz, Latin, Funk, the Fat Fingers of Funk mix it all up into one funky gumbo and serve it up hot for your listening pleasure.

FOUNDLINGS

Foundlings are a Brighton/London quartet band who play melodic, guitar-driven indierock, who plan to release a new EP via Last Night From Glasgow in March.

GLASHIN

Hastings guitar-and-flute duo Paul and Jo Dengate perform traditional and contemporary from England and Ireland.

INGRID PITT ORCHESTRA

This Hastings collective performed their Eastern European influenced folk on accordion, fiddle, clarinet, tea chest bass, cajun drum and saw.

JAKE RIZZO

Not to be confused with the Florida State quarterback, Jake is an acoustic singersongwriter from Leamington Spa.

This Hastings-born artist plays folk-inspired pop songs.

A new acoustic project from Justin Gartry. A long-term Joe Strummer Foundation affiliate, his new project explores a more minimalistic set-up.



KID STRANGE

Kid Strange hail from Margate and deliver infectious hooks covered in a blanket of dreamy guitars, bolstered by a driving rhythm section.

KING SIZE SLIM

Former guitarist for The Selecter, Toby Barelli has a reputation as a must see act on the roots, acoustic and blues circuits.

LAZYBONES

Brighton trio play fuzzy rock in the vein of Queens of the Stone Age, Slaves, Idles and Royal Blood.

LE SKIV

HASTINGS FAT TUESDAY AND 247 TAXIS GO GREEN WITH REUSABLE CUPS

ASTINGS

Hastings Fat Tuesday will be the first multivenue festival in the UK to become single use, plastic cup free. As a coastal town, we have a responsibility to save our oceans and to stop swamping landfill with endless quantities of plastic cups.

The UK produces 400 million tons of plastic every year and 40% of that plastic will only be used once before it is binned. Carrier bags, drinks bottles, crisp packets and of course, events cups are prime examples of single use plastics.

A desire to see an end to all this waste has driven 247 Taxis to join forces with Fat Tuesday and Plastic Free Hastings. Stew Smith from 247 Taxis says, "247 are delighted to be working with the Fat Tuesday team bringing

a vision of reusable plastic glasses to a major event in Hastings. Whilst we are looking at this year as a trial, we would hope that between ourselves and other local companies we can build on the foundations for many years and promote events in Hastings as the leaders in reducing event plastic waste. Help support our vision by grabbing yourself a pint glass during the Fat Tuesday."

Fat Tuesday have designed a cool collectable re-usable cup to commemorate its 10th anniversary in an effort to reduce its negative environmental impact. These cups can be purchased from all the participating bars at

£2 per cup. You can then use this cup in all the bars as you tour around watching all the fantastic free music around town. Once the festival is over you can take your cup home and use it again! In addition to the re-usable cups,

In addition to the re-usable cups, all the participating pubs will be using compostable plastic cups as back up. These are not ideal as we don't have an industrial compost site in the South East of England. This means that the compostable cups will be incinerated but won't release a noxious gas as other plastics do.

This is just the start, we would like to see all other Hastings events and festivals use this same model in order to really reduce our single use plastics. Eventually we would like to see reusable cups used all year round in all our pubs.

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


